A weekend retreat for girls to engage in trust building activities, personal bonding within the sisterhood, and to learn the value of support. This weekend will be inclusive of workshops, guided meditations, ropes course and FUN!

WHO ARE WE?

Identifying ourselves and identifying the goals for our collective.

THROUGH THE LENS OF MY MOTHER

An exploration of mother/daughter relationships and how we view ourselves based on our mothers' projections. Mothers are invited to participate.

SERVICE IS THE GIFT

A conversation about servant leadership. We will then engage in a service project benefitting girls in the foster care system.

RISE UP GIRL

A focus on why girls are relevant and meaningful in today's society. A deep exploration on the process of finding our purpose and becoming who we are designed to be.

MY BODY, MY POWER

A real conversation about body image, sexual health and autonomy over one's self.

CONTROLLING MY NARRATIVE

A look into how society and the media tells the story of Black & Brown girls. Girls will look at the story they are telling about themselves through their social media accounts.

CREATING MY LEGACY

Various activities such as vision boarding, A Look In The Mirror, education discussions, development of a resume, etc.

CHARTING MY COURSE

A panel discussion with young women in the arts, activism, business, etc., who are close in age with program participants. Discussion will revolve around charting your path at a young age.

BEAUTY IS ME

In partnership with Beauty That Cares and Black beauty brands.

SECURING THE BAG

A discussion about finances, the truth about paying for college and how to get a head start on seeking scholarships.

OWNING THE GAME

Designed to introduce entrepreneurship and allow girls to learn all about the process of running their own business.







Participant Information

COHORT DETAILS

Each year the program will accept a maximum of 30 girls.

SELECTION PROCESS

Interested young ladies must fill out an application and meet with us for a brief interview. This will give us the opportunity to get acquainted, learn more about you and what you are seeking from a mentoring program.

AGE REQUIREMENT

Interested young ladies should be between the ages of 11-17 years old.

PARENT PARTICIPATION

Parent or guardian participation is a <u>REQUIREMENT</u> of the program. Parents will be required to attend every parent circle to engage in their own process of understanding how they can support their daughter during her time in the program.

FEES

Participants will be responsible for the cost of IMANEE Retreat.


